


Sponsor Organization: Organization that sponsors the program; usually, these organizations employ the health care providers and often provide financial support for the program

Sponsor Org. Type: Type of organization that sponsors the program; types include community/mental health center, federally qualified health center (FQHC) or look-alike, for-profit or private organization, hospital or medical center, local health department, non-profit/community-based organization

Program Type:

- *School-based health centers (SBHC):* partnerships between schools and community health organizations that deliver primary health care, at minimum, through a fixed site on a school campus. Each site where the health center is physically located is counted as a program
- *School-linked health care (SLHC):* Programs are linked with schools to coordinate and provide health care for students. Services are delivered off campus through a fixed site near the school. Each district that the sponsoring organization has a partnership with is counted as a program.
- *School-based mental health programs (SBMHP):* Programs are partnerships similar to SBHCs but only provide behavioral/mental health. Each site where a mental health provider physically goes to is counted as a program.
- *School-based oral-health programs (SBOHP):* Programs are partnerships similar to SBHCs but only provide oral health care. Each site where the program is physically located is counted as a program.
- *Telehealth programs:* Programs deliver 100% of school-based health care services using telemedicine technology. Each site where telehealth equipment is located is counted as a program.
- *Mobile health care programs:* Programs are without a fixed site that rotate a health care team through a number of schools, including mobile van/bus/clinic on wheels that parks on or near school property/campus.

Region/County/District: Program offers services in the listed region(s), county(ies), and district(s). Regions are as defined by the Missouri Primary Care Association (see map below).



Services Provided

- *Behavioral health:* Services can include group, family, or individual counseling, psychiatric services, prevention education, or case management.
- *Oral health:* Services can include education, screenings/exams, sealants, fluoride treatment, general care, or care coordination.
- *Physical health without acute care:* Services can include immunizations, well child visits, sport physicals, chronic condition management, education, or case management.
- *Primary care:* Services include acute care and treatment at a minimum but may also include, immunizations, well child visits, sport physicals, chronic condition management, education, or case management.
- *Vision care:* Services can include screening, exams, or provision of corrective eye wear.
